The Monastery Church exterior recently underwent extensive brick repair to both north and south transepts. Serious water damage had acted on a bad batch of bricks resulting in decay requiring immediate attention. With God's help, we found the best workman in the area who did an excellent job. Due to the potential for further damage, we are also planning to beautify the outside of the Church with a special paint that will seal the brick from further, costly damage.
