have six students working under the direction of internationally recognized iconographers, Anton and Ekaterina Daineko. The monastery has been excited to watch the progress on the center for liturgical arts and icon studio building, funded by a generous donation by Theodore and Victoria Kulik–we anticipate its completion by the spring, though we hope to have students working in it by the end of the year! Thanks be to God for this gift and for your prayers and support that make it possible! The monastery brotherhood is currently made up of 18. We don't have room for many more, and thank God for all that we do have and for each one of us who are here. We continue to do the main work of prayer both in the liturgical life of daily prayer, and the life of prayer of the heart in the cell. Our work at the seminary and our relationship with its members continues to flourish by the mercy of God, and provides an invaluable way for us to help the Church in the world by forming her future priests, deacons, and workers.
